Catalonia is a nation whose origins go back to the Middle Ages. It has its own language and its own singular traditions in culture, politics and law.

The history of Catalonia's political institutions began towards the end of the VIIIth century.

Its origins lay in the old Carolingian "Marca Hispanica", which progressively became a sovereign State with a territory spreading from Occitania to southern versant of Pyrenees with its capital in the city of Barcelona. The holding from the XIth century onwards of the Assemblees de Pau i Treva (Peace and Truce Assembly) was the embryo of the Catalan Corts-(Parliament). From the XIIth century onwards these Corts represented the townspeople, the clergy and the nobility in the decision and making processes. Thus Catalonia was the pioneer of the movement towards the parliamentary system and was well ahead of the other Mediaeval Kingdoms in that respect.

In 1359 the Corts set up a delegated power named Generalitat, which progressively assumed more and more legal and political powers. This pattern of political organization set up the basis for the States of Catalan-Aragonese Confederation for centuries, until the early XVIIIth century - País Valencià, Balears, Catalonia and Aragon - and partly for the other mediterranean Kingdoms of the Confederation —Naples, Sicily and Neopatria in Greece—. This institution was abolished by Philip V, Bourbon pretender to he Crown against Charles of Austrian Royal Household, after Catalan-Aragonese Confederation was defeated and occupied as a result of Succession War (1702-1714). It was reestablished in the year 1931 only to be abolished again in 1939 and finally re-established in the year 1977.

Today Catalonia is governed by an Autonomy Statute ratified in a referendum by the Catalan people in 1979. It consists of an autonomous political power. In some matters Catalonia has an exclusive devolved jurisdiction of its own, in some others shares it with the central Government Catalonia has a President, a Parliament and a Government of its own, a High Court and an "Ombudsman"

Being a country situated in the north-eastern zone of the Iberian Peninsula, and forming the part closest to Europe within the ensemble of Catalan-speaking lands, it is geogra-phically and culturally opened to Europe and the Mediterranean, and is characterized by its industriousness, its innovation capacity and its contributions to artistic and scientific vanguards at several moments in its llenary history.

With regard to the Spanish State, Catalonia has the 6.3% of the territory, the 15.9% of the inhabitants. the 16.6% of the active population, the 19.3% of the Gross National Product (GNP), between the 23 and the 24% of the tax collection and between the 11 and the 14% of the public expenses in the consolidated budgets of the Spanish State. It is economically the most dynamic and advanced area in the Iberian

The participation of Catalonia in terms of homogeneous purchasing power within the GIP (Gross Inner Product) of the EEC accounts as much as 1.7% within the total figure of 9.2% Spanish economic share.

This Catalan percentage is higher than the whole economic weight of Luxembourg and Ireland, very close to those of Greece and Portugal and slightly lower than the Danish share.

If we consider the 143 European territorial units, Catalonia holds the 14th place in extension and the 7th place in terms of population.

If we assign a value of 100 to the average purchasing power of the 12 EEC member countries, Catalan percentage would rise up to 92.7% of that figure, whereas the whole Spanish percentage would suppose
